College Bound Program

- ✓ Funded by Cuyahoga County
- ✓ What is it? \$20 Daily living stipend to help with daily living expenses.
- ✓ Eligibility: High school Diploma or GED and aged out of foster care in Cuyahoga County.
- ✓ Enrolled in a degree, certificate or other accredited program at a college, university, technical or vocational school.
- ✓ Registered for full time credit hours per quarter or semester (full time credit hours for Summer classes)
- ✓ Maintain a 2.0 GPA
- ✓ Eligible until age 23.
- ✓ Submit class schedule <u>and</u> Grades per semester/quarter to College Bound Coordinator to confirm that you continue to meet the program requirements.
- ✓ Contact the College Bound Coordinator 216-881-4495

Educational Training Voucher (ETV)-Foster Success Education Services

# The Ohio ETV program is open to any former and current young person in foster care who meets at least one of these criteria:

- Foster care will end on and after your 18th birthday.
- In foster care at age 17 and not enrolled in high school, but have earned a GED or vocational certificate and will remain in foster care until you turn 18.
- Completed state requirements and have a high school diploma and will remain in foster care until you turn 18.

• Left foster care after your 16th birthday because you were adopted or placed in a kinship guardianship.

#### Additionally, you must:

- Be a U.S. citizen or qualified non-citizen
- Have personal assets (bank account, car, home, etc.) worth less than \$10,000
- Be enrolled in a degree, certificate or other accredited program and show that you are making satisfactory academic progress.


Ohio ETV recipients must maintain a minimum 2.0 GPA each term. Students must submit an academic transcript showing grades and GPA from the most recently completed semester/term.

- ✓ Establish a PIN <u>www.pin.ed.gov</u> This is used to send and correct info on the FAFSA
- ✓ Establish an email address
- ✓ Complete before October 1st to be eligible to receive the Ohio College Opportunity Grant
- ✓ Reapply every academic year to be eligible for Ohio College Opportunity Grant and the Pell Grant
- ✓ List all the schools and colleges that you have a desire to attend.
